Use your profession to bring Christ to other peoples!

God can use you not only here, but also cross-culturally. He is already using everyday, workplace Christians to bring people to Jesus in other cultures (called “tentmakers” after the apostle Paul who supported himself by making tents).

One of our teachers taught English in Asia to flight attendants needing to upgrade their conversational skills. He invited them to an English language Bible study in his home. Over time, more and more came. They began to see Jesus, and placed their trust in him. From the outset, the group was full of life and the new believers began to draw others to Christ.

After two years, when their job contract ended, the group grew into a simple house church with its own leaders. When he returned a few years later, he learned that the group had started eight more churches and brought hundreds to Christ!

You will hear teachers tell their stories at GO Equipped! And you will also hear other stories of God using tentmakers in their professions around the world.

Talk about exciting! They will all tell you that tentmaking is a key strategy in working toward fulfilling the great commission.

God is using ordinary Christians like you who are willing to surrender their lives and professions to his purposes. Start by getting equipped.

A tentmakers biggest challenge is to be effective once they arrive overseas. This course focuses totally on equipping you to be effective. And it is also relevant to your ministry now, before you ever go overseas.
